

The City Council meets the 1st and 3rd Monday of each month at 7 PM in the Council Chambers, 3rd Floor, 245 Washington St, Watertown NY. The 2nd Monday of each month is held for Work Sessions, which are open discussions of topics requested by the Mayor and City Council. If there is a holiday on Monday, the Council Meeting or Work Session will take place on the following day, Tuesday. Public is welcome to attend all meetings. Fire Department

Confined Space Rescue Training:



The Watertown Fire Department is currently training our members in Confined Space Technician. This training is being provided by grant funds through the FEMA Assistance to Firefighters Grant that was awarded to our department. The training takes each shift a week to complete and is being offered to the entire department. When this training is completed, the department will move into Trench Rescue Technician training, which is also funded by the same grant.



Haz-Mat Response:



On February 19, 2025, the Watertown Fire Department responded to the Town of Henderson as mutual aid to the Henderson Fire Department for a hazardous materials incident involving a 1,000-gallon underground propane tank that had been struck by a snowplow and was leaking. Christman Fuels was on the scene before the fire department's arrival and attempted to stop the leak; however, the service valve was sheared off. The Henderson Fire Department stretched a precautionary hose line for crew

protection. Watertown Fire Department HazMat crews applied a wet towel to the plugged valve in an attempt to auto-refrigerate the leak while a propane flaring kit was being prepared for use. Propane flaring is a controlled operation used to safely empty a damaged propane vessel. The Henderson Fire Department and Watertown Fire Department utilized meters to monitor the atmosphere and nearby buildings. Flaring operations continued until the tank was emptied.

Electrical

Water Department



Operator and maintenance staff at the Pollution Control Facility replaced the impeller on #2 grit pump. The grit removal system at the treatment plant removes inorganic coarse materials- such as sand, dirt, and coffee grounds- to protect downstream equipment from damage.

Trickling Filter gate 1 is now fully operational. During the repair process, the crew at the Pollution Control Facility took advantage of the opportunity as a valuable training exercise. Senior and junior staff worked together to learn how to repair the shaft and set the high and low limits on the gate actuator.





The Chief Operator at the Pollution Control Facility was accepted into the Water Leadership Institute (WLI). Out of 184 applicants, only 84 were selected for the WLI 2025 program. This intensive program provides

participants with management training and leadership development through a blended learning approach. It explores complex challenges in the water and wastewater industries while fostering networking opportunities with professionals from both the public and private sectors.



Final A sludge pump 2 has been reinstalled after a complete rebuild, while Pump 1 has been removed for reconstruction. Final A settling tank removes 90-95% of the settleable solids before the disinfection process. The sludge pump plays a crucial role in removing these solids from the system.

Staff at the WWTP utilized their expertise and innovative problemsolving skills to design and install a new piping section. This will enhance the efficiency of future digester cleaning and inspections. Their proactive approach reflects a dedication to enhancing plant operations and preserving critical infrastructure.





Cleaning and inspecting a digester at the WWTP requires extensive preparation. Maintenance and operations staff removed a 6-inch pump that previously fed the digester and are installing new piping to accommodate a new piston pump. The new piping arrangement will provide flexibility, allowing operators to use the new pump for feeding the digester, transferring digested sludge between digesters, or directing it to the drain.

Service Repair:



Multiple service repairs have been conducted by the Watertown Distribution Department. The work performed included ball valve replacements, curb box resets, and frozen meter or service repairs. One service was repaired on Thompson Blvd.



Main Break/Leak Investigation:

Staff have continued to perform leak studies on various sections of the Distribution System. On 2/27/25 a 10-inch main was repaired on Pearl Street, and on 3/2/25, a 6-inch main was repaired on Bishop Street.


